NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS	5 FEET
GREEN SPACE	6 - 8 FEET
SPECIAL USE FACILITIES	5 FEET

PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT WILL DETERMINE THE PARK DESIGNATION.

NOTE:

1. COLORADO LIME STONE IN NATURAL PARKS AND GREEN SPACES. RED TO DARK PINK DECOMPOSED GRANITE USED FOR NEIGHBORHOODS AND REGIONAL PARKS UNLESS OTHERWISE DIRECTED BY OWNER. ALL MATERIALS WILL BE COMPACTED.
2. TRAIL BORDER WILL BE CONCRETE CURB OR CUT STONE (MORTARED OR UNMORTARED) PER DETAIL 1301S-2-SM
3. IN AREAS OF EROSION CONCRETE SIDEWALK WILL BE INSTALLED OR OTHER APPROVED NON-ERODIBLE SURFACE FOR TABLE AT LOCATION OF EROSION.
4. RAMPS AT INTERSECTION WILL BE CONCRETE. AT STREET INTERSECTION FOLLOW CITY DETAIL 432S-3-SM.
5. TRAIL MARKERS OF APPROVED DESIGN SHOWING DISTANCE ALONG PATH AS DIRECTED BY CITY WITH TRAIL NAME AND DISTANCE FROM START. MARKERS MUST BE HIGHLY VISIBLE FROM BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE TRAIL. TRAIL MARKERS TO BE PLACED 1 FOOT OFFSET FROM EDGE OF TRAIL.
6. MATERIALS AND CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SPECIFICATIONS.
7. CLEAR ZONE CAN BE SHIFTED TO ONE SIDE PER PROJECT'S CONSTRAINTS. CLEAR ZONE CAN NOT HAVE LARGE SHRUBS OR TREES WITHIN IN IT AND WILL HAVE 10 FEET (8 FEET MINIMUM) OF OVERHEAD CLEARANCE. TREES 9" OR LARGER REQUIRE MITIGATION PER CODE IF REMOVED.
